

Beatrice SCHMID studied Ibero-Romance and Slavic Philology as well as History at the Universities of Basle, Saint Petersburg, Barcelona, Valladolid and Sofia. She gained her PhD from Basle University with a thesis on the modernised Valencian editions of the *Blanquerna* (1521) and the *Scala Dei* (1523) and obtained the *venia docendi* at the same university with a postdoctoral thesis on the language of Estéfano de Sevilla, a physician of the XIV century.

She taught Catalan at Basle University and was visiting professor in Spanish Linguistics at the universities of Berne, Neuchâtel and Zurich. Since 1999, she has been Professor of Ibero-Romance Linguistics at the University of Basle.

Her main research interests are in the fields of historical linguistics (Catalan, Hispanic and Romance in general) and she leads a research group on Judeo-Spanish Language at Basle University.

Beatrice Schmid is a corresponding member of the *Institut d'Estudis Catalans* (since 1997) and the *Real Academia Española* (since 2015). Currently she is vice-president of the *Associació Internacional de Llengua i Literatura Catalanes* (since 2015) and former president of the *Sociedad Suiza de Estudios Hispánicos* (from 2002 to 2005) and vice-president of the *Swiss Academy of Humanities and Social Sciences* (from 2010 to 2012).

Furthermore, she belongs to the editorial boards of several journals and collections such as *Boletín Hispánico Helvético* (Geneva), *Acta Romanica Basiliensia* (Basle), *Estudis de llengua i literatura catalanes* (AILLC, Barcelona), *Estudis Romànics* (IEC, Barcelona, 2000-2005), *Llengua & Literatura* (SCLL-IEC, Barcelona), *Études Linguistiques / Linguistische Studien ELS* (Leipzig), *Biblioteca Lingüística Catalana* (Universitat de València), *Lletres Asturianas* (ALLA, Oviedo), *Publicaciones de Estudios Sefardíes* (CSIC, Madrid), *Sefarad* (CSIC, Madrid) and *El Prezente* (Ben-Gurion University, Beer-Sheva).
