PETER PAGIN: Propositions vs structured meanings

In this paper I will provide definitions of what it is for a meaning to be fully structured, partially structured, and fully unstructured. I will connect this to one aspect of the problem of the unity of the proposition: that of having its content essentially. It will turn out that one aspect of this problem does not depend on internal structure only, but also on the nature of the truth relation. Finally, I will consider some proposals for structured propositions from the perspective of these two properties: being structured, and being true.
