Have questions about criteria and qualifications for the JPA? Read on:

Am I eligible to participate?

- JPAs are no more than 28 years old, and hold the equivalent of a Bachelor's degree (with some relevant experience), a Master's degree, or be at PhD candidate with a superior academic record.
- Candidates should possess outstanding qualitative and quantitative analytical skills in a specialized field and be comfortable using technology to maximize work.
- Candidates should also possess fluency in English and, preferably, at least one other Bank language (French, Spanish, Russian, Arabic, Portuguese, or Chinese).

How do I apply?

Interested candidates should apply online. Only those identified for a JPA assignment will be contacted. Final decisions are made by the Hiring Manager on a highly competitive basis.
