Medical coverage: Students from countries that are members of the European Economic Area (European Union countries, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway) and who are entitled to Social Security benefit in their own country should present their European health insurance card. The form for this card is issued by your country's public health authorities and entitles you to medical care in Spain. Students from countries outside the European Economic Area should establish whether there is a medical agreement between the social security system in their country and in Spain (this is the case for some Latin American countries). If there is one, you should request the relevant document from the health authorities in your country. This document will entitle you to

medical care in Spain. Accidents and repatriation coverage: All students must prove an insurance that covers accidents and repatriation.
