

Registration, Podium and Poster Presentations Submission

Pre-registration for general attendees and submission for 16 podium and 25 poster presentations is still open using the downloadable pre-registration form. Podium presentations will be 20 minutes in length followed by a 10-minute Q & A period.

Abstract Submission Instructions

A 150-word abstract and name(s) and affiliation(s) of coauthor(s) can be submitted using the downloadable pre-registration form. Submissions will be reviewed by the **scientific committee** and contributions will be accepted based on originality, scientific merit, and best integration with the whole submission pool. On May 8th 2018, applicants will receive an email confirming acceptance with assigned session for oral or poster presentation and instructions on how to register.
