
Questionnaire – Incoming Students June 2016

(76 responses)




Was it easy for you to enroll? (76 responses)




How satisfied were you with the way the Erasmus office dealt with any questions, complaints or problems that may have come up during your participation in the Erasmus program?




Were the announcements of the Erasmus office of the University of Barcelona sufficient?





There are not so much courses in English



What were the criteria for you to choose UB for your Erasmus exchange studies?




Was UB your first choice? (76 responses)



How satisfied were you with the quality of content of the courses? (76 responses)




How satisfied were you with the quality of teaching methods (76 responses)

The communication between professors and students was often not so smooth, sometimes something was not posted in the Campus Virtual and as an Erasmus student without having contact with other local students it was hard or impossible to find out that for example a class did not take place.

Its hard to find the courses the UB offers for the Erasmus in the web page in first instance and in second instance, you have to change all the courses you've already chosen because in the preenrollment process the UB only gives you the oportunity of certain coruses, that you "might" chose if they have place for you and they are available.

I only took one course so I can't offer a vast view on the courses. Dirección Estratégica in Spanish was a good course, with variable teaching methods.

We had to do a lot of works in groups and it got difficult as some students didn't worked very well.
