Parte B. RESUMEN DEL CV

I joined the UB in 2017 as the PI of a 'Retos' JIN project of the Spanish Science Ministry on conceptual variability (score A). In 2020, I was awarded a Beatriz Galindo Distinguished Fellowship, a Serra Hùnter lectorship, teaching positions at the UNED, the Univ. Complutense of Madrid, the Univ. of Valencia, and I was awarded a CIDEAGENT 2020 – Excellence in Research Grant (Valencia) (score 96%) for the project 'Value in language: public discourse, collective attitudes, and responsibility' (all declined). I'm now co-PI of a project at the UB, funded by the Spanish Science Ministry, on the philosophy of hybrid representations (score A), which pursues new developments in the area, and the coordinator of WorkPackage 7 on dissemination and outreach of the María de Maeztu Research Programme on the role of evidence with BIAP – the Barcelona Institute of Analytic Philosophy.

Since 2017, my work has focused mostly on conceptual variability, collective attitudes and their linguistic

expression, and their role in derogatory speech, hate speech, and propaganda, and how models of communication need to be revised to accommodate these phenomena.

I have 34 publications since 2015. I have published 14 papers in Q1 journals, 3 papers in Q2 journals, 2 chapters in OUP and 2 in Routledge books, and 1 chapter with Springer. I have several chapters forthcoming in OUP and Routledge edited collections. I co-edited a book with OUP on conceptual variability, one with Routledge on legal and philosophical perspectives on collective action, and a special issue of *Erkenntnis*. I am currently editing a special issue of the *Review of Philosophy and Psychology*. The output of my work is significant in philosophy. My Scopus h-index is 10, with 347 citations; my Researcher ID h-index is 8, with 252 citations. My Google scholar h-index is 15, with a total of 758 citations, of which 497 since 2020. I've delivered 19 keynote or invited lectures since 2020. I regularly engage in outreach actions: in 2018 I talked at the UNESCO at the event La Nuit de la Philosophie; in 2019 I participated in public debates at the CCCB with other recognized scholars discussing issues like disinformation and propaganda. I've recently participated in a public debate in Vienna on Propaganda in Times of War. I led a round table on the right to information at the Barcelona Mobile Week in 2022. I have written for *Diari Ara*. I also wrote for the blog *Justice Everywhere*. I coordinate the blog *Open Philosophy*.

My work has been cited in the *Stanford Encyclopedia of Philosophy*, and in major journals such as *Analysis*, *Australasian Journal of Philosophy*, *Dialectica*, *Erkenntnis*, *Inquiry*, *Linguistics & Philosophy*, *Mind*, *Noûs*, *Pacific Phil. Quarterly*, *Phil. Compass*, *Phil. & Phenomenological Research*, *Philosophical Quarterly*, *Philosophical Studies*, *Synthese*, *Thought*, etc. My papers on disagreement, retraction, metalinguistic negotiations, and pejoratives are listed in the 20 most impactful and relevant papers on each of these topics, according to PhilPapers.

I have taught at undergraduate and graduate level at the University of Barcelona, the University Pompeu Fabra, the University of Lisbon, and the University of Maryland (Global Campus). I have mentored five postdocs, supervised 2 PhD students, and co-supervise 4 PhD students, and have supervised 3 masters students. I'm now the coordinator of the APhil master program (in Analytic Philosophy) at the University of Barcelona.

I organized more than 10 international conferences and workshops, was an invited speaker at 40 workshops, conferences or seminars in the last 5 years. I have served as a reviewer for leading journals such as *Mind*, *Synthese*, *Phil. Studies*, *Erkenntnis*, *Ergo*, *Australasian Journal of Philosophy*, *Phil. Quarterly*, *Linguistics & Philosophy*, etc. I was editor of the journal *Disputatio* (2009-2017), and since January 2023, I'm the Subject Editor for Philosophy of Language at *Thought*.

I served as a member of the Steering Committee of the European Society for Analytic Philosophy (2014-2020, and 2020-2023). I have also served as a reviewer for the Agencia Estatal de Investigación, in Spain, and as an expert reviewer for Marie-Sklodowska Curie Individual Fellowships (European Commission), and in other funding organizations.
