Ana María Debon
(Universitat Politècnica de València)

Ana Debón is an Associate Professor at the Department of Statistics of the “Universitat Politècnica de Valencia”, Spain. She holds a PhD in Mathematics. She has been a Visiting Researcher at the Concordia University (Canada) and at the Cass Business School (UK).

Her research is focused on the field of statistics (Modeling and Forecasting mortality) with actuarial applications. Her work has appeared in leading journals such as North American Actuarial Journal, Insurance, Mathematics and Economics or European Actuarial Journals.



Enrique Devesa
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José Enrique Devesa is an Associate Professor at the Department of Financial and Actuarial Economics of the “Universidad de Valencia”, Spain. He holds a PhD in Economics and Business. Actuary by the “Universidad Complutense de Madrid”. Member, on the proposal of the Council of Ministers, of the Committee of Experts that developed the Sustainability Factor of the pension system in 2013. Member of the “Instituto de Investigación Polibienestar”.



Alfredo Duarte Egidio dos Reis
(ISEG-Universidade de Lisboa)

Alfredo D. Egidio dos Reis holds a degree on management, a MSc in applied mathematics to economics and management both from ISEG, Technical University of Lisbon, and a PhD in actuarial mathematics and statistics from Heriot-Watt University, Edinburgh (UK). He is now Professor of Finance at ISEG, Universidade de Lisboa, research at CEMAPRE (Centre for Applied Mathematics to Forecasting and Economic Decision) and co-editor of the European Actuarial Journal. He is a fellow of the Portuguese Institute of Actuaries, Portuguese Mathematical Society and of the Order of Economists.

Alfredo’s research interests include different areas of actuarial science and risk theory, such as ruin theory and credibility. His main research have been published in ASTIN Bulletin, Insurance: Mathematics and Economics, Scandinavian Actuarial Journal and European Actuarial Journal.



Silvia Herms
(AMICE)

Silvia Herms is Head of Economics and Finance at AMICE, the European Association of Mutuals and Cooperatives. She is responsible for the Prudential Regulation and Financial Reporting Working Group at AMICE. In her role she represents AMICE at the meetings organized by the European institutions (i.e. European Commission and EIOPA) and other European Stakeholders (i.e. Insurance Europe, CRO Forum and AAE) on Solvency II. Silvia is also member of EFRAG Insurance Accounting Working Group which is the body in charge of advising the European Commission on the suitability of IFRS17 for the Insurance Sector.

After graduating in Economics and Actuarial Science from the University of Barcelona, she started her career at KPMG as auditor of financial and insurance companies focusing on the audit of financial statements under US GAAP, IFRS, French GAAP, Italian GAAP and Local GAAP. In 2002 she moved to the Actuarial department, becoming the responsible person at the KPMG Barcelona office in 2003. She left KPMG to join the Economics and Finance department at Insurance Europe where she lead the work on proportionality in Solvency II. In 2008 she moved to AMICE and has been focused on Solvency II and Financial & Accounting issues since then.
